PILLAR

1

Providing education and training that meet the needs of a changing economy through labour-market alignment and relevance.



PILLAR

2

Supporting lifelong learning opportunities for all students by focusing on equity and how it relates to access, affordability, and student and graduate transitions.



PILLAR

3

Promoting innovative strategies and supports for sustainable, adaptable, high-quality PSE systems.

CROSS-CUTTING THEMES

- 1. Mental health and well-being:** This theme focuses on promoting mental health and well-being in PSE students, adults, and the workforce.
- 2. Indigenous postsecondary education:** Ministers, provinces, and territories, through CMEC, have committed to continuing their work on the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's Call to Action, including action 63, and to promote and support the Indigenous and Northern Affairs Department's Indigenous and Northern Affairs Act (INAA) and the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples (UNDRIP).
- 3. Digitalization:** This theme focuses on the digitalization of postsecondary education, and the role of digital technology in the PSE sector, as a key lever for a sustainable recovery, growth, and innovation.
